1. Forms to *Request to Reschedule Final Exam Form* are available outside the office of Bev Rutledge in the Andreas Center, top floor.
2. Secure the approval of the faculty member involved and the Dean of Students.
3. Secure this approval at least one week prior to the beginning of the exam period.
4. Rescheduled exams for any student graduating in 2008 needs to be scheduled prior to noon on Wednesday, May 14<sup>th</sup>.
